Introduction

- Uber's Reentry into Denmark via JV with Drivr
- Uber: multinational transportation company; provides ride-hailing services
- 70 countries and 10,500 cities
- Failure last time → success this time?

Financial Metrics 2023	
Global Revenue	\$36.7 billion
Profit Margin	7.8%
Market Share:	68% in global ride-hailing
Denmark →	Potential for profitability through hybrid model

Uber's Past Entry & Exit in Denmark

- Initial Entry (2014): Faced regulatory challenges with Denmark's taxi law.
- Exit (2017): Legal issues led to Uber's departure due to failure to meet taxi law requirements.
- WHY reentering Denmark?
- JV = perfect mix of lesser risk + positive stance from government and labor unions
 - Compliance with taxi regulations → hybrid taxi model

Hofstede's Cultural Dimensions

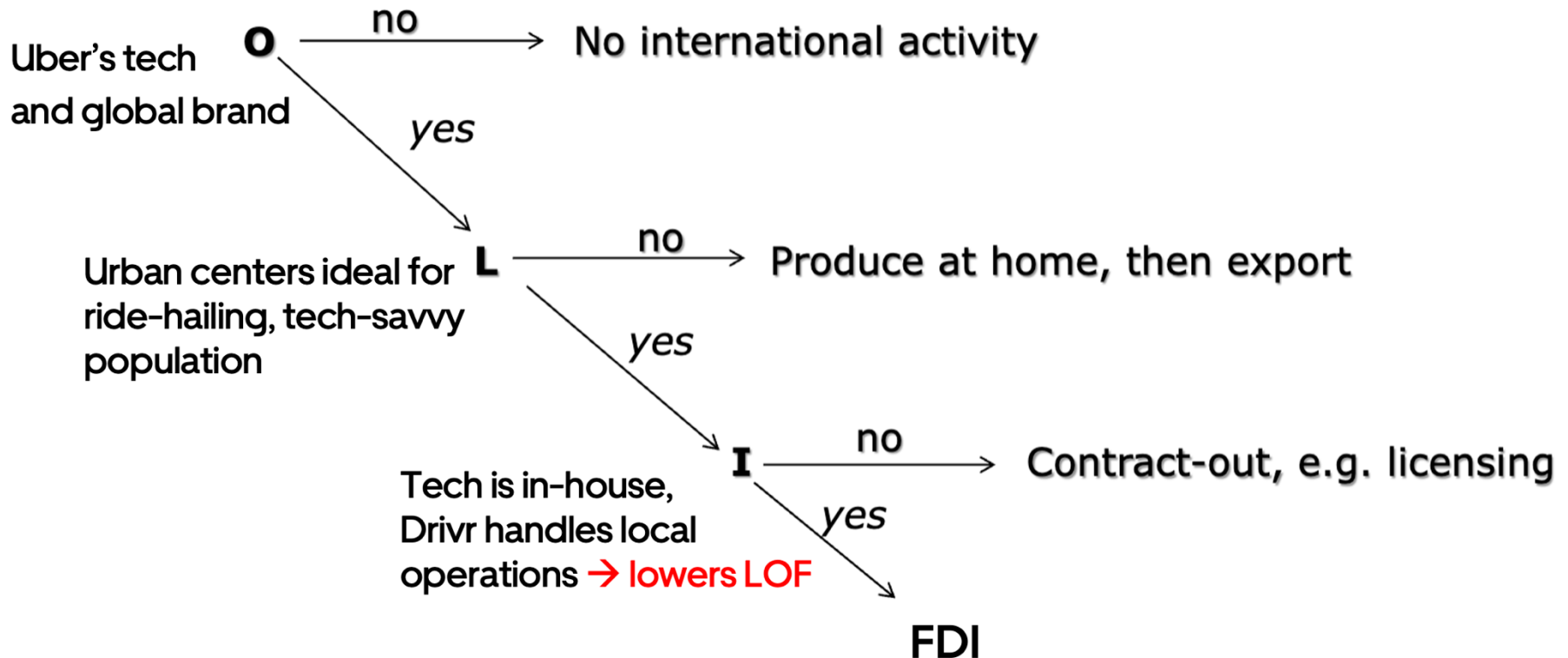
- Power Distance: Low → needs to decentralize operations
- Individualism: High → drivers want flexibility, autonomy
- Uncertainty Avoidance: High → legal transparency needed
- Femininity: Customer service and work-life-balance
